Item 0 WELCOME & INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

0.1 Dr. D. B. Shakyawar, Chairman TXD 04 extended a hearty welcome to the committee members and the invitees. He highlighted the indispensable role of stakeholders in standardization activities, as well as underscored the pivotal role of standards in ensuring quality in the field of wool products and floor coverings. He also emphasized active deliberation on task undertaken by the committee to formulate a standard on railway blanket.

0.2 Member Secretary also extended a hearty welcome to the Chairman and members of TXD 04.

Item 1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

In view of no comments received, the committee formally confirmed the minutes of the 27th meeting of TXD 04 held on 12 January 2024 through video conferencing were circulated vide BIS DG letter no. TXD 04/A2.27 dated 24 January 2024.

Item 2 SCOPE AND COMPOSITION OF TXD 04

2.1 The committee noted the present scope and reviewed the composition of TXD 04 as given in Annex 1 to the Agenda and DECIDED as under:

a) Dr. Praveen Kumar will represent Directorate of Animal Husbandry, Jaipur as principal member and name of alternate member will be informed.

b) To seek fresh nomination from All India Carpet Manufacturers' Association, Bhadohi.

c) To recommend to Textile Division Council (TXDC), the co-option of National Woollen and Finishers, Panipat in TXD 04. Shri Suresh Singhal and Shri Aditya Singhal shall represent as principal member and alternate member respectively.

d) To recommend to Textile Division Council (TXDC), the co-option of Wilton Weavers, Kerala in TXD 04. Smt. Malini Gautham and Shri Vinod Kumar shall represent as principal member and alternate member respectively.

e) To recommend to Textile Division Council (TXDC), the withdrawal of Department of Sheep Husbandry, Ladakh from TXD 04.

3.1 The Committee NOTED the summary of actions taken on the various decisions of the 27th meeting as given in Annex 2 to the agenda.

Item 4 DRAFT STANDARD FOR FINALIZATION

4.1 The committee considered the wide circulation draft on 'Textiles — Wool/Polypropylene and Wool/Nylon Blended Blankets — Specification' [Doc. No. (24805)] (First Revision of IS 12848 : 1989) and comments received from AAA Spinners, Panipat, National Woollen and Finishers, Panipat, IICT, Srinagar, Northern Railways and Shri Makarand Mehendale, Obeetee Pvt. Ltd., Bhadohi, as given in Annex 3 and Annex 4, Annex 4A, Annex 4B to the Agenda respectively.

After detailed deliberation, the committee decided as follows:

a) To substitute the following Table 2 for the existing:

c) Rewrite the clause 4.3 as follows:

The blanket shall be manufactured in plaid, tartan, or geometric pattern (*see* Fig. 1, Fig. 2 and Fig. 3), or as agreed between buyer and seller and shall be milled, and given a raised finish.

d) Insert the following Fig.3 for geometric pattern:

The committee further decided that the above draft is held to be finalized for publication after incorporating the above-mentioned changes. BIS may carry out the editorial changes in the draft, if required.

Item 5 WORKING DRAFT ON HANDMADE PASHMINA CARPET FOR P-DRAFT APPROVAL

5.1 The committee considered the working draft on 'Handmade Pashmina Carpet' as submitted by the panel constituted under the convenorship of Dr. Zubair Ahmad, IICT, Srinagar and as given in Annex 5 to the Agenda. After detailed deliberation, the committee decided to circulate the draft to all the committee members for a time period of 15 days, eliciting the technical comments. The committee further decided that the comments received along with the draft will be placed in the next committee meeting for discussion and decision.

Item 6 INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES

6.1 The committee considered the following International Standard published by ISO/TC 219 on Textile Floor Covering:

i) ISO/TS 21868:2023 Textile Floor Coverings — State of the Art on Maintenance and Cleaning

After deliberation, committee decided that the following members shall review the above ISO standard and give their suggestions/recommendations within 07 days to BIS for adoption of above standard:

- i) Dr. Betty Das Gupta, IICT Bhadohi
- ii) Shri Srinath Vanaparti, Welspun Flooring Ltd. Hyderabad
- iii) Shri Makarand Mehndale, Obeetee Pvt. Ltd, Gopiganj

The committee further decided that based on suggestions/recommendation (If adopted), the preliminary drafts on above ISO standards shall be prepared by BIS and the same shall be issued for wide circulation for eliciting technical comments for two months. BIS may carry out any editorial changes in the draft, if required.

Item 7 NEW WORK ITEM PROPOSALS

7.1 The committee considered the new work item proposal on Broadloom Wool Carpet along with the inputs/technical data sheet received from Wilton Weavers, Kerala to formulate a new standard on the subject as given in Annex 7 to the Agenda. After detailed deliberation, the committee decided to constitute a panel with the following composition to prepare the working draft on the aforementioned subject:

- i) Dr. Betty Das Gupta, IICT Bhadohi (Convenor)
- ii) Shri Srinath Vanaparti, Welspun Flooring Ltd. Hyderabad
- iii) Shri Mayur Basuk, Wool Research Association, Thane
- iv) Shri Makarand Mehndale, Obeetee Pvt. Ltd, Bhadohi
- v) Shri Ajay Kumar, CSWRI, Avikanagar
- vi) Shri Himanshu Shukla, BIS

The committee further requested Wilton Weavers, Kerala to share the detailed test results, raw material requirements etc. covering all the varieties of broadloom wool carpets for discussion/deliberation in the panel meeting.

7.2 The committee considered the list of following new subjects on textile floor coverings identified during a consultative meeting organized with standardization cell of Ministry of Textiles and officials of Ministry of Home Affairs for framing Rolling Annual Action Plan 2024-25 on Friday, 01 March 2024 through videoconferencing:

- i) Polyamide carpet and floor covering with special finishes like anti- soil, anti- microbial, anti-odor, anti- stain, anti-static
- ii) Polyamide carpet and floor covering with special finishes like water repellent
- iii) Polyamide carpet and floor covering with fire-retardant properties
- iv) Polyester carpet and floor covering with special finishes like anti- soil, anti- microbial, anti- odor, anti- stain, anti-static

- v) Polyester carpet and floor covering with special finishes like water repellent
- vi) Polyester carpet and floor covering with fire-retardant properties
- vii)Polypropylene carpet and floor covering with special finishes like anti-soil, anti-microbial, anti- odor, anti-stain, anti- static
- viii) Polypropylene carpet and floor covering with special finishes like water repellent
- ix) Polypropylene carpet and floor covering with fire-retardant properties
- x) Polyamide carpet and floor covering with special finishes like UV stabilizer and heat resistant
- xi) Polypropylene carpet and floor covering with special finishes like UV stabilizer and heat resistant
- xii)Polyethylene carpet and floor covering with special finishes like UV stabilizer and heat resistant

After deliberation, the committee decided to refer the above subjects to panel constituted under item 7.1 to discuss and suggest the possible inclusion of subject/varieties in the following existing standards:

- a) IS 17478 : 2020 Wall to Wall Carpets Made of Polyamide (Nylon) Yarn
- b) IS 17479 : 2023 Carpet Tiles Made of Synthetic Yarn
- c) IS 18158 : 2023 Artificial Grass Carpet made of Synthetic Yarn for Landscape

The committee further decided that based on the panel recommendation, the standards listed at Sl. No. a) to c) will be taken up for revision and the revised working prepared will be placed in the next committee meeting for discussion and decision.
