Subject: Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024 (at ROs/BOs/Labs)

The Central Vigilance Commission vide Circular No. 09/08/24 dated 28.08.2024 (copy enclosed) has informed that this year the Week from 28th October 2024 to 03rd November 2024 be observed as the Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024. This year the theme of Vigilance Awareness Week is "सत्यनिष्ठा की संस्कृति से राष्ट्र की समृद्धि - Culture of Integrity for Nation's Prosperity"

- 2. Accordingly, Vigilance Awareness Week shall be observed in all offices of BIS from 28th October to 03rd November 2024 in compliance with the directions of Central Vigilance Commission as envisaged in their above mentioned circular.
- 3. All DDGRs, DDG(Labs), DDG (PRT), Heads of the Branch Offices, Heads of Laboratories, Head(NITS) shall organize observance of the Week at the respective Regional/Branch offices/Labs/NITS as under:
 - i) All Regional Offices This would include Labs at the station concerned.
 - ii) All Branch Offices located away from Regional Offices This would include Labs at the station concerned.
 - iii) Central Lab, Sahibabad including GZBO
 - iv) NRO Laboratory
 - v) NITS and NOBO Noida
- 4. Administration of Integrity Pledge at ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS The observance of the Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024 would commence with the taking of the Integrity Pledge by public servants on 28thOctober, 2024 (Monday) at 1100 hrs. The Integrity Pledge for Organizations, as per Annexure B of CVC Circular, may be administered by the Activity Heads/DDGRs/HoDs concerned at the respective Regional/Branch Offices/NITS/Laboratories.
- 5. Integrity Pledge for Citizens –All ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS are requested to publicize Integrity Pledge amongst all employees, their families, vendors / suppliers /contractors / stake holders, students etc. to elicit wider participation. Integrity pledge for Citizens is enclosed at Annexure A of CVC Circular.
- 6. **3 months campaign from 16th August, 2024 to 15th November, 2024 as a prelude to VAW 2024** All the Activity Heads at BIS HQ, DDGRs, DDGA and all Heads of ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS/GSD/Admn//ITS have already been requested on 16 August 2024 to undertake a 3 months campaign from 16th August, 2024 to 15th November, 2024 as a prelude to VAW 2024 on Preventive Vigilance measures and to ensure active participation by all concerned in this campaign to achieve significant outcomes, as communicated by Central Vigilance Commission vide its Circular No. 08/08/24 (Ref. No. 024/VGL/081/36147) dated

01.08.2024. The following Preventive Vigilance activities be taken up as focus areas by all the Ministries / Departments / Organization:

- a. Capacity Building Programs
- b. Identification and implementation of Systemic Improvement measures,
- c. Updation of Circulars/ Guidelines/ Manuals,
- d. Disposal of complaints received before 30.06.2024.
- e. Dynamic Digital Presence

Brief description of the above 05 parameters are given in **Annexure A** attached to the Commission's circular dated 01.08.2024.

- 7. Vigilance Department (HQ) will be organizing an All India Chess Online Competition inviting participation of all the employees of BIS across India. Prizes to the winners of All India Chess Online Competition will be given by BIS HQ out of the funds allocated to Vigilance Department. All employees of BIS (including contractual staff) may participate in this competition.
- 8. Vigilance Department at BIS HQ shall be organizing activities in respect of BIS HQ before/during the VAW 2024.
- 9. All RO/BOs are advised to conduct activities relevant to the theme that strives to bring about maximum public participation. RO/BOs should conduct different outreach programs that aim to sensitize the public about the need for transparency and integrity in public governance. The PIDPI poster may be widely circulated and translated to regional languages, wherever feasible. RO/BOs may prepare posters on PIDPI on their own.
- 10. RO/BOs may conduct various competitions such as Essay, Slogan, debate, quiz etc. for the employees and their families on issues relating to the theme/anti-corruption; workshops/sensitization programs for employees and other stakeholders and also promote the concept of e-Integrity Pledge amongst stakeholders. Special emphasis may be given to engage the youth in various activities emphasizing the importance of integrity and ethics.
- 11. RO/BOs are requested to carry out outreach activates for public/citizens as following:
 - a. BIS Standards Clubs shall be utilized for creating awareness about PIDPI resolution in various schools, colleges and premier educational institutes across the country.
 - b. Publicize integrity Pledge amongst all employees, their families, vendors / suppliers / contractors / stake holders, students etc. to elicit wider participation. Integrity pledge for citizens and organizations enclosed at **Annexure A and B** of circular dated 28.08.2024.
 - c. Undertake activities such as walkathons, marathons, street plays etc. which have visibility and mass appeal across all strata of society.
 - d. Extensive use of social media platforms, bulk SMS / e-mails, WhatsApp etc. for spreading awareness. For different social media related initiatives, the social media handles of the Central Vigilance Commission may be tagged. (Twitter: @CVCIndia: Facebook: CVCofIndia)
 - e. Vendor meets may be organized wherever necessary, through online mode or otherwise, whichever is more feasible.

- f. Organize "Awareness Gram Sabhas" for dissemination of information regarding the menace of corruption and the different measures that the public can undertake to redress it, such as complaint portals etc. Indicative list of activities which can be conducted as part of "Awareness Gram Sabhas" is at **Annexure C** of circular dated 28.08.2024.
- 12. It is requested that a detailed programme for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024 may be prepared and sent to Vigilance Department for information at the earliest.
- 13. A report on all the activities taken up towards observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024 as per format available at Annexure D(1) to D(6) attached to CVC circular dated 28.08.2024 (copy enclosed) together with supporting "Photographs" be sent by each BIS Office to Vigilance Department latest by 18 November 2024 for forwarding a consolidated report from the Vigilance Department to the Central Vigilance Commission, New Delhi.
- 14. Budgetary provision for various offices of BIS for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2024 as approved by Competent Authority i.e. DG, BIS is enclosed herewith.

It is imperative that all organizations should conduct outreach programs that aim to sensitize the public about the need for transparency and integrity in public governance.

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- 4. Activities which may be conducted within the organizations include the following:
 - a. Encourage employees to take e-pledge by visiting the website. Online "Integrity Pledge" is available at CVC's website (www.cvc.gov.in) and can be accessed by all.
 - b. Conduct workshops/sensitization programs for employees and other stake holders on policies/procedures of the organization and on Preventive Vigilance measures.
 - c. Conduct various competitions such as debates, quiz etc. for the employees and their families on issues relating to anti-corruption.
 - d. Promote the concept of e-Integrity Pledge by persons with whom the organization deals with.
 - e. Vigilance Study Circles may also conduct outreach and awareness programs.
- 5. Outreach activities for public / citizens may include the following:

 - d. Organize grievance redressal camps for citizens/ customers by Organizations having customer-oriented activities. Similarly, vendor meets may be organized wherever necessary, through online mode or otherwise, whichever is more feasible.
 - e. Organize "Awareness Gram Sabhas" for dissemination of information regarding the menace of corruption and the different measures that the public can undertake to redress it, such as complaint portals, etc. As per past practice, Public Sector Banks need to conduct "Awareness Gram Sabhas" at the Branch level in at least two Gram Panchayats. Other organizations may also organize wherever possible. Indicative list of activities which can be conducted as part of "Awareness Gram Sabhas" is at **Annexure C** of this circular.

Description of Preventive Vigilance activities to be undertaken during the campaign period (16th August to 15th November 2024) as a precursor to Vigilance Awareness Week 2024

1. CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

(a) Initiative

A robust training system for employees is important for any organization to succeed in its objective and functioning. The Commission intends to focus on capacity building of employees who have been newly recruited in the last few years on key aspects of Preventive Vigilance. All Ministries / Departments / Organizations may conduct structured training programme for fresh inductees. 5. DYNAMIC DIGITAL PRESENCE

- iii) A proper system to be developed by assigning responsibilities to all designated administrators for regularly visiting the website and providing inputs to the webmaster with due approval for modification / deletion / up-dation.
- iv) A system of submission of periodic compliance certificate with respect to website up-dation to specified authority / NIC may be introduced by the department,
