Subject: Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2023 (at ROs/BOs/Labs)

The Central Vigilance Commission vide Circular No. 08/09/2023 dated 11.09.2023 (copy enclosed) has informed that this year the Week from 30th October 2023 to 5th November 2023 be observed as the Vigilance Awareness Week, 2023. This year the theme of Vigilance Awareness Week is " अष्टाचार का विरोध करें; राष्ट्र के प्रति समर्पित रहें" "Say no to corruption; commit to the Nation"

- 2. Accordingly, Vigilance Awareness Week shall be observed in all offices of BIS from 30th October to 5th November 2023 in compliance with the directions of Central Vigilance Commission as envisaged in their above mentioned circular.
- 3. All DDGRs, DDG(Labs), DDG (PRT), Heads of the Branch Offices, Heads of Laboratories, Head(NITS) shall organize observance of the Week at the respective Regional/Branch offices/Labs/NITS as under:
 - All Regional Offices This would include Labs at the station concerned.
 - ii) All Branch Offices located away from Regional Offices This would include Labs at the station concerned.
 - iii) Central Lab, Sahibabad including GZBO
 - iv) NRO Laboratory
 - v) NITS and NOBO Noida
- 4. Administration of Integrity Pledge at ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS The observance of the Vigilance Awareness Week, 2023 would commence with the taking of the Integrity Pledge by public servants on 30thOctober, 2023 at 1100 hrs. The Integrity Pledge for Organizations, as per Annexure B of CVC Circular, may be administered by the Activity Heads/DDGRs/HoDs concerned at the respective Regional/Branch Offices/NITS/Laboratories.
- 5. Integrity Pledge for Citizens –All ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS are requested to publicize Integrity Pledge amongst all employees, their families, vendors / suppliers /contractors / stake holders, students etc. to elicit wider participation. Integrity pledge for Citizens is enclosed at Annexure A of CVC Circular.
- 6. **3 months campaign from 16th August, 2023 to 15th November, 2023 as a prelude to VAW 2023** All the Activity Heads at BIS HQ, DDGRs, DDGA and all Heads of ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS/GSD/Admn/PMWD/ITS have already been requested on 11 August 2023 (**copy enclosed**) to undertake a 3 months campaign from 16th August, 2023 to 15th November, 2023 as a prelude to VAW 2023 on Preventive Vigilance measures and to ensure active participation by all concerned in this campaign to achieve significant outcomes, as communicated

by Central Vigilance Commission vide its Circular No. 06/08/23 (Ref. No. 023/VGL/035/556448) dated 02.08.2023. The following Preventive Vigilance activities be taken up as focus areas by all the Ministries / Departments / Organization:

- a) Awareness building about Public Interest Disclosure and Protection of Informers (PIDPI) Resolution,
- b) Capacity Building Programs,
- c) Identification and implementation of Systemic Improvement measure,
- d) Leveraging of IT for complaint disposal.
- e) Updation of circulars/ Guidelines / manuals,
- f) Disposal of complaints outstanding as of 30.06.2023.

Brief description of the above 06 parameters are given in Annexure A attached to the Commission's circular dated 02.08.2023.

- Vigilance Department (HQ) will be organizing an All India Chess Online Competition and All India Photography Competition inviting participation of all the employees of BIS across India. Prizes to the winners of All India Chess Online Competition and All India Photography Competition will be given by BIS HQ out of the funds allocated to Vigilance Department. All employees of BIS (including contractual staff) may participate in these competitions.
- Vigilance Department at BIS HQ shall be organizing activities in respect of BIS 8. HQ before/during the VAW 2023.
- All RO/BOs are advised to conduct activities relevant to the theme that strives to bring about maximum public participation. RO/BOs should conduct different outreach programs that aim to sensitize the public about the need for transparency and integrity in public governance. A poster on PIDPI is available at **Annexure C.** The poster may be widely circulated and translated to regional languages, wherever feasible. RO/BOs may prepare posters on PIDPI on their own.
- RO/BOs may conduct various competitions such as debates, quiz etc. for the employees and their families on issues relating to anti-corruption; workshops/sensitization programs for employees and other stakeholders and also promote the concept of e-Integrity Pledge amongst stakeholders. Special emphasis may be given to engage the youth in various activities emphasizing the importance of integrity and ethics.
- 11. RO/BOs are requested to carry out outreach activates for public/citizens as following:
- a. BIS Standards Clubs shall be utilized for creating awareness about PIDPI resolution in various schools, colleges and premier educational institutes across the country.
- b. Publicize integrity Pledge amongst all employees, their families, vendors / suppliers / contractors / stake holders, students etc. to elicit wider participation. Integrity pledge for citizens and organizations enclosed at Annexure A and B of circular dated 11.09.2023.
- c. Undertake activities such as walkathons, marathons, street plays etc. which have visibility and mass appeal across all strata of society.
- d. Extensive use of social media platforms, bulk SMS / e-mails, WhatsApp etc. for spreading awareness. For different social media related initiatives, the social media handles of the Central Vigilance Commission may be tagged. (Twitter: @CVCIndia: Facebook: CVCofIndia)

- e. Vendor meets may be organized wherever necessary, through online mode or otherwise, whichever is more feasible.
 - f. Organize "Awareness Gram Sabhas" for dissemination of information regarding the menace of corruption and the different measures that the public can undertake to redress it, such as complaint portals etc. Indicative list of activities which can be conducted as part of "Awareness Gram Sabhas" is at **Annexure E** of circular dated 11.09.2023.
 - It is requested that a detailed programme for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week,
 2023 may be prepared and sent to Vigilance Department for information at the earliest.
 - 13. A report on all the activities taken up towards observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2023 as per format available at Annexure **D(i)** to **D(vi)** attached to **CVC** circular dated 11.09.2023 (copy enclosed) together with supporting "Photographs" be sent by each BIS Office to Vigilance Department latest by 23 November 2023 for forwarding a consolidated report from the Vigilance Department to the Central Vigilance Commission, New Delhi.

Sub: Observance of Vigilance Awareness week 2023.

Bringing transparency and accountability in governance remains one of the primary means to achieve all round development of the country. The Central Vigilance Commission, as the apex integrity organization of India, adopts different initiatives to strive towards ensuring integrity in public administration. Vigilance Awareness Week is one of the tools of the Commission in increasing public awareness about the perils of corruption. Vigilance Awareness Week is observed every year during the week in which the birthday of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel (31st October) falls in. The Commission has decided that this year Vigilance Awareness Week would be observed from 30th October to 5th November, 2023 with the following theme:

"श्रष्टाचार का विरोध करें; राष्ट्र के प्रति समर्पित रहें" "Say no to corruption; commit to the Nation"

- 2. The observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2023 would commence with the taking of the integrity pledge (copy enclosed at the Annexure A) by public servants in the Ministries / Departments / Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) / Public Sector Banks (PSBs) and all other organizations on 30th October, 2023 at 1100 hrs.
- 3. In a move towards inculcating the true spirit of participative vigilance, the Commission had earlier issued instructions detailing a **three-month campaign period** (16th August, 2023 till 15th November, 2023) in which following preventive vigilance measures were to be taken up as focus areas by all the Ministries / Departments and Organizations:

 a. Awareness building about Public Interest Disclosure and Protection of Informers (PIDPI) Resolution,

b. Capacity Building programs,

- c. Identification and implementation of Systemic Improvement measures,
- d. Leveraging of IT for complaint disposal,
- e. Updation of Circulars / Guidelines / Manuals,
- f. Disposal of complaints received before 30.06.23.
- 4. All organizations are advised to conduct activities relevant to the theme that strives to bring about maximum public participation. It is imperative that all organizations should conduct different outreach programs that aim to sensitize the public about the need for transparency and integrity in public governance. A poster on PIDPI has been prepared and is available at **Annexure C**. The poster may be widely circulated and translated to regional languages, wherever feasible. You may prepare your own posters too.
- 5. Action taken report regarding the six Preventive Vigilance measures that are to be taken up as focus areas during this three-month campaign period should be sent by all to the Central Vigilance Commission as per the format enclosed at Annexures D (i) to D(vi) by 8th December 2023 (Friday).
- 6. During Vigilance Awareness Week 2023, special emphasis may be given to engage the youth in various activities emphasizing the importance of integrity and ethics. Organizations should promote activities that involve the youth and foster an environment that re-affirms the importance of their involvement in the fight against corruption.
- 7. Activities to be conducted within the organizations may include the following:
 - a. Employees may be encouraged to take e-pledge by visiting the website. Online "Integrity Pledge" is available at CVC's website (www.cvc.gov.in) and can be accessed by all.
 - b. Conduct workshops/sensitization programs for employees and other stake holders on policies/procedures of the organization and on Preventive Vigilance measures.
 - Vigilance Study Circles may conduct different outreach and awareness programs.
 - d. Conduct various competitions such as debates, quiz etc. for the employees and their families on issues relating to anti-corruption.
 - e. Promote the concept of e-Integrity Pledge by persons with whom the organization deals with.

 - a. All Ministries / Departments / Organizations shall publicize integrity Pledge amongst all employees, their families, vendors / suppliers / contractors / stake holders, students etc. to elicit wider participation. Integrity pledge for citizens and organizations enclosed at Annexure A and B.
 - Organizations may undertake activities such as walkathons, marathons, street plays etc. which have visibility and mass appeal across all strata of society.
 - c. Extensive use of social media platforms, bulk SMS / e-mails, WhatsApp etc. for spreading awareness. For different social media related initiatives, the social media handles of the Central Vigilance Commission may be tagged. (Twitter: @CVCIndia; Facebook: CVCofIndia)
 - d. Organize grievance redressal camps for citizens / customers by organizations having customer-oriented activities. Similarly, vendor meets may be organized wherever necessary, through online mode or otherwise, whichever is more feasible.
 - e. Organize "Awareness Gram Sabhas" for dissemination of information regarding the menace of corruption and the different measures that the public can undertake to redress it, such as complaint portals, etc. As per past practice, Public Sector Banks need to conduct "Awareness Gram Sabhas" at the Branch level in at least two Gram Panchayats. Other organizations may also organize wherever possible. Indicative list of activities which can be conducted as part of "Awareness Gram Sabhas" is at Annexure E.

WHAT IS PIDPI?

- PIDPI is a resolution of Government of India
- Identity of the complainant is kept confidential for all complaints lodged under it

HOW IS PIDPI COMPLAINT FILED?

- The Complaint should be addressed to Secretary, CVC and the envelope should be superscribed as "PIDPI"
- Name and Address of the complainant should NOT be mentioned on the envelope but in the letter inside in a closed cover

GUIDELINES TO ENSURE IDENTITY OF COMPLAINANT REMAINS CONFIDENTIAL

- Complaints that are personally related to the complainant or addressed to other authorities may lead to disclosure of identity.
- Complaints should not be sent in open condition or on public portal
- Documents that reveal identity should not be enclosed or mentioned in the complaint. Eg: documents received under RTI
- Name and Address should be mentioned on the letter inside the envelope for confirmation purposes.
- Complaints where confirmation is not received are closed.
- Anonymous / pseudonymous letters are not entertained

The following is a list of indicative activities for conducting "Awareness Gram Sabhas".

- Organize meetings in Gram Panchayats inviting all stake holders like the Sarpanch members of Gram Panchayat, Self-Help Groups (SHGs), workers of MGNREGA, farmers, students, and citizens. Head of Gram Sabha / Sarpanch or any dignitary could be requested to deliver lecture on awareness against corruption followed by discussion. Anti-Corruption messages in vernacular languages can also be displayed at the meeting.

Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week remains one of the primary tools of preventive vigilance with the focus on building awareness and re-affirming the commitment of everyone to uphold integrity in public governance.

- 2. As a prelude to Vigilance Awareness Week 2023, the Commission has desired that all organizations may undertake a three-month campaign (16th August 2023 15th November 2023) with the following Preventive Vigilance measures as focus areas:
 - Awareness building about Public Interest Disclosure and Protection of Informers (PIDPI) Resolution,
 - b. Capacity Building Programs,
 - c. Identification and implementation of Systemic Improvement measures,
 - d. Leveraging of IT for complaint disposal,
 - e. Updation of Circulars/ Guidelines/ Manuals.
 - f. Disposal of complaints received before 30.06.2023.

Brief description of the above 06 parameters is given in **Annexure A** attached to the Commission's circular dated 02.08.2023.

- 3. In view of the above, all the Activity Heads at HQ, DDGRs, DDGA and all Heads of ROs/BOs/Labs/NITS/GSD/Admn/PMWD/ITS are requested to undertake a three-month campaign from 16th August 2023 till 15th November 2023 as a prelude to VAW 2023 on Preventive Vigilance activities to bring about noteworthy results during the campaign as communicated by Central Vigilance Commission vide its Circular No. 06/08/23 (Ref. No.023/VGL/035/556448) dated 02.08.2023.
- 4. All the Vigilance Officers entrusted with the task of vigilance related activities under different Disciplinary Authorities are requested to ensure compliance of the above instructions and to ensure active participation by all concerned in this campaign to achieve significant outcomes in all the ROs/BOs under respective jurisdiction. Description of Preventive Vigilance activities to be undertaken during campaign period (16th August 2023 – 15th November 2023) as a precursor to Vigilance Awareness Week 2023

1. AWARENESS BUILDING ON PIDPI RESOLUTION

As per policy of Government of India, no action is to be taken on anonymous / pseudonymous complaints. However, if a complainant wishes to keep his identity confidential, there is a provision of filing complaints under Public Interest Disclosure and Protection of Informers (PIDPI) Resolution.

With a view to popularize PIDPI Resolution, the following activities may be undertaken:

- All Ministries / Departments / Organizations may undertake awareness campaigns on PIDPI resolution;
- A poster on the provisions of PIDPI has been prepared and is attached at Annexure B. This may be displayed at all offices and translated into local languages, wherever deemed necessary;
- Organizations may consider preparing jingles / videos to convey information regarding PIDPI resolution in an attractive, and easy to understand manner;
- d. Talks / seminars / public interactions / gram sabhas may be conducted clearly explaining the provisions of PIDPI resolution, the correct procedure of filing a PIDPI complaint and the common pitfalls / mistakes made while filing PIDPI complaints.

2. CAPACITY BUILDING

Training of officials to impart necessary competency and skill is necessary in order to ensure smooth and effective functioning. All Ministries / Departments may ensure that extensive training is given to the officials in the following five thematic areas:

- a. Role of IO/PO in conducting inquiries,
- b. Public procurement,
- c. Ethics and governance,
- d. Systems and Procedures of the organization, and
- e. Cyber hygiene and security.

During the 3-month campaign period, select officials (master trainers) may be trained extensively by experts in the field, and these officials may subsequently be utilized as resource persons for imparting in-house training.

3. <u>IDENTIFICATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF SYSTEMIC IMPROVEMENTS</u>

Preventive Vigilance initiatives are key in taking a proactive approach against the menace of corruption. Towards this goal, the following action plan may be taken up:

- a. All Ministries / Departments may analyze the cases of the last 05 years to identify the common areas where corruption occurs and initiate / implement systemic improvements to tackle the same,
- The Commission has already advised systemic improvement measures in various cases. The organizations may make a special drive to implement these measures.

4. LEVERAGING OF IT FOR COMPLAINT DISPOSAL

Timely disposal and monitoring of complaints is essential to ensure that illegal acts are identified and stopped at the right time. It also brings about a sense of trust in the complainant. To achieve this, web portals, apps and other IT initiatives can be utilized.

All Ministries ./ Departments / Organizations should develop and implement online portals for receipt and tracking of complaints received by the CVOs (time frame for development of such portals to be indicated by them).

5. UPDATION OF CIRCULARS / GUIDELINES / MANUALS:

In continuation of earlier instructions, all organizations should work towards identifying circulars / guidelines / manuals which are required to be updated and take necessary steps to ensure updation of the same.

6. DISPOSAL OF COMPLAINTS

It is necessary to ensure that complaints are not kept pending and that they reach the logical conclusion within the prescribed time period. All organizations may ensure that all complaints received on or before 30.06.23 may be disposed of.

PUBLIC INTEREST DISCLOSURE & PROTECTION OF INFORMER RESOLUTION, 2004 (PIDPI)



WHAT IS PIDPI?

- PIDPI is a resolution of Government of India
- Identity of the complainant is kept confidential for all complaints lodged under it

HOW IS PIDPI COMPLAINT FILED?

- The Complaint should be addressed to Secretary, CVC and the envelope should be superscribed as "PIDPI"
- Name and Address of the complainant should NOT be mentioned on the envelope but in the letter inside in a closed cover

GUIDELINES TO ENSURE IDENTITY OF COMPLAINANT REMAINS CONFIDENTIAL

- Complaints that are personally related to the complainant or addressed to other authorities may lead to disclosure of identity.
- Complaints should not be sent in open condition or on public portal
- Documents that reveal identity should not be enclosed or mentioned in the complaint. Eg: documents received under RTI
- Name and Address should be mentioned on the letter inside the envelope for confirmation purposes.
- Complaints where confirmation is not received are closed.
- Anonymous / pseudonymous letters are not entertained
