#### 0. WELCOME & OPENING REMARKS

**0.1** In the opening remarks, DG stressed for adhering strictly to the work plan submitted by DDGRs in the last ROs/BOs meeting held on 11 & 12 December 2017.

#### 1. PRODUCT CERTIFICATION ACTIVITY

#### 1.1 Review of achievement vis-à-vis work plan submitted by ROs/BOs

During the previous ROs/BOs meeting held at NITS on 11-12 December 2017, all BOs had submitted work plans indicating the targets to be achieved by end of Dec 2017, Jan 2018, Feb 2018 and Mar 2018.

During this meeting, the performance of all BOs up to 31 Dec 2017 was reviewed by DG-BIS in the presence of ADG, DDG (PP&C), DDG (Certification), DDG (MSCD), and DDG (CAD) and the performance was discussed with the respective DDGRs and Head BOs. During the discussions, following emerged:

## 1.2 Utilization of Manpower

i	The manpower utilization reported by BOs is enclosed as <b>Annex 6</b> . It was noted that several BOs had reported a manpower utilization of less than 75% which was deemed unsatisfactory. BOs clarified that since only limited manpower is available and there is a large amount of paperwork related to applications, renewals, inclusions etc that is to be processed in addition to inspections, they are not able to achieve higher manpower utilization. BOs were requested to make efforts to improve manpower utilization to 80%.	All BOs

## 1.3 Action points/decisions

Based on discussions and feedback received from ROs/BOs, the following action points were identified:

i.	BOs cited lack of adequate manpower as a reason for not being able to meet targets for surveillance inspections and sample drawal. In this context, BOs referred to the planned deputation of officers from HQ for carrying out preliminary inspections/verification visits of PDW and Paver Block applications and requested that they may be allowed to utilize the services of these officers for surveillance inspection as well. 	The same was agreed but BOs were requested to ensure that allotment of visits to these officers may be done keeping in mind that these officers will be constrained in terms of local knowledge (language, travel routes etc.)	
ii.	BOs had informed since many of the mandatory products under certification are quite bulky, it is not possible to draw market samples of the same. BOs were informed that a list has been circulated earlier for such bulky products for which market sample cannot be drawn and BO may instead obtain customer feedback for such products which will be counted as market sample. Further, for some products which serve as raw material for other producers, raw material samples may be drawn and treated as market samples of the raw material supplier, e.g. MS ingots serve as raw material for steel rolling mills, so MS ingots samples may be drawn from rolling mills and treated as market sample of the MS ingots producer. iii.	BOs informed that since a number of manufacturing units may not be under production, it may not be possible to achieve the total target of surveillance inspections by March 2018. It was decided that BOs may provide a list of such manufacturing units. Further, in case surveillance inspection targets cannot be met, the same may be compensated by drawing higher number of market samples.	All BOs
iv.	DDGN suggested that since visits were being paid on a regular basis to units under lot inspection, surveillance inspection and market samples of such units may not be required and targets may therefore be amended accordingly. Further, BOs reported that surveillance inspections of such units were being done mostly during the lot inspection visits. V.	BOs informed that a number of grant of licence cases were pending/delayed owing to test reports being awaited from labs and due to action pending from applicant's end. BOs were requested to provide the list of such cases which are delayed owing to pending test reports or action pending on applicant's end. Further, as discussed during previous ROs/BOs meeting, BOs were again requested to send information about such delayed priority sample test reports to <a href="mailto:pcsamples@bis.gov.in">pcsamples@bis.gov.in</a> . vi.	During previous ROs/BOs meeting, DDGRs had been requested to hold regular meetings with Lab Heads so that issues such as delayed test reports, disputed samples may be resolved at the earliest. During discussions, DDGRs confirmed that these meeting were being held regularly.	All BOs

	March 2018, DDGS/CNBO-2 were requested share their modus operandi so that it may be emulated by other BOs. DDGS/CNBO-2 clarified that since there are around 1300 PDW licences under CNBO-2, they had concentrated on drawing PDW samples, which are plentifully available, due to which they had been able to draw a large number of samples. All other ROs/BOs were requested to take note of this and make similar efforts.
