#### 0. WELCOME & OPENING REMARKS:

**0.1** At the outset, ADG welcomed DG and all the Heads of the ROs and BOs to the meeting. He informed that after the BIS Act 2016 has been finalized, this was the first meeting of ROs/BOs being held. He opined that as per the provision of new Act for mandatory certification, an enabling provision to appoint agencies other than BIS has been made in the Act, therefor Bureau has to gear up for future.

**0.2** In her Opening Remarks, DG welcomed all the members from different regions and branches in the ROs/BOs meeting. DG stated this was the stage to identify the need and scope for changes in Bureau after the implementation of BIS Act 2016. The new Act challenges the monopolistic position, Bureau was holding in certification activities. However, Bureauas National Standards Body (NSB) of India has a unique position wherein we have legal protection and provisions and therefore, have special role to perform as we have huge responsibility to provide quality and safety products/ services for which Bureau was created.

**0.3** DG informed that in the last week, she had visited WRO and CL and was of opinion that lot of soul searching and introspection was required as our Standard Mark does not aspire the same confidence that it used to have in 1970s and 1980s. She remarked that BIS has not kept pace with the time, our internal processes are way too old and entire digital process has by passed us and now was the time to look at path for transformation and change, keeping in view the overall objective of the organisation.

**0.4** DG remarked that most of the ROs/BOs have not met their physical targets and there seems to be lack of self-governance. This time region-wise review meetings have

been organized separately along with the parallel sessions to solve problems of ROs/BOs with regard to other activities of BIS like Technical Information Services, Finance, Certification, PR etc. Detailed presentation of BIS Act 2016 and its implementation and Hallmarking have also been arranged.

**0.5** DG emphasized that as part of standards organization, our work should be reflective of standards.She mentioned that all should work with self- discipline and deliver on our own, the promised targets. At the end, DG stated that being National Standards Body, BIS should be open and ready to change and have two-way communication and remain updated because if BIS fails then several organisations are there to fill the gap if we do not perform.

#### 1. PRODUCT CERTIFICATION ACTIVITY

- **1.1** The performance of ROs-BOs vis-à-vis the manpower utilization and achievement of targets on various certification aspects was reviewed based on the details provided by them as given at **Annex-1**.
- **1.2** From the deliberations, it emerged that the general issues for non-achievement of targets pertain to the following:

SI.No.	Reasons for Non-achievement
1.2.1	<b>Problems pertaining to Manak-Online</b> - Lack of software stabilization and difficulties encountered in operating Manak-Online and also the staff employed in BOs are not provided access to Manak-Online, which increases the workload on Officers.
1.2.2	<b>Low data speed-</b> The data speed of 2 Mbps provided by NIC is inadequate for speedy upload/download of data/ documents or generation of reports.
1.2.3	<b>Delay by Applicants</b> - Delays on part of the Applicant is not reflected in the data on pendency being reviewed.
1.2.4	<b>Delay on account of Test Reports-</b> Test Reports are not always received in time due to long duration testing time of samples/routing of samples between multiple labs/ other reasons. This adds to the overall pendency.

#### 1.5 Video Conferencing

During the concluding session, DG expressed desire to convene review meetings with DDGRs through video conferencing, likely to held on **15January 2018**, **15 February 2018 & 15 March 2018** for assessing performance vis-a-vis action plan submitted by ROs/BOs.

#### 2. HALLMARKING ACTIVITY

During deliberation on the agenda items related to hallmarking, following was discussed:

#### 2.1 Review of achievement vis-à-vis the target for 2016-17

The performance of all ROs/BOs w.r.t annual targets upto 25<sup>th</sup> Nov 2017 for hallmarking activity in terms of surveillance audits of A&H Centres, Grant of jeweler licence, market surveillance and capacity building programmes as enclosed at **Annex 3** was reviewed Region wise.It was observed that achievement w.r.t surveillance audits of A&H Centres and market surveillance was not up to the mark. Based on the review the following emerged:

**2.2** Members were apprised about provisions specific to Hallmarking in BIS Act 2016, BIS Rules 2017 and draft BIS Hallmarking Regulations. The provisions of Section 14, 15, 26 and 29 of the BIS Act 2016 and provision of compensation specified in BIS Rules were explained. Also the provisions of conformity assessment schemes specified in the draft regulation for the refined precious metal and precious metal articles with respect to certificate to the jeweller including revised fee structure; recognition to assaying and hallmarking centre and licence to the manufacturer engaged in refining of precious metal(s) were explained.

#### 3. MANAGEMENT SYSTEM CERTIFICATION ACTIVITY

#### 3.1 Review of Performance of ROs/BOs

3.1.1 Grant of Licence – It was noted that the performance with respect to grant of licence till 30 November 2017 was very low. Overall only 30% targets have been met. It was also noted that 66 applications are pending and if all of them matured into grant of licence by 31 March 2018, then also only 75% of the targets will be met. It was informed that due to promotional efforts, LIC is likely to submit application for certification of its eight units including seven training divisions located at various places. Efforts are also being made for bringing KVIC, Orissa Power Transmission Corporation Ltd. (OPTCL) under the ambit of systems certification. The regions were advised during the meeting to maximize their efforts for meeting the targets of grant of licence. All DDGRs assured that all out efforts will be made for achieving the targets and all processing of pending applications shall be completed by them before 31<sup>st</sup> March 2017.

#### 8. CLOSING REMARKS BY DG

8.1 DG remarked that after detailed review of all the regions and elaborate comments received on problems being faced on operation of Manak-Online, that technology should serve as a tool to make our work simple and should not delay the process because manpower is precious and we should focus to use our expert manpower very judiciously.

- **8.2** In the next three months not much change in terms of manpower and improved system should be expected, and the situation may be reviewed thereafter.
- **8.3** DG expressed that she was happy and pleased by the work plan presented by all the regions and commented that as good Standards body, we must establish and ensure that our resources are mobilized more and more.
- **8.4** DG congratulated Management System Certification Department (MSCD) for the way BIS inspections were carried out. She further expressed that good feedback has been received from the organizations for the work done by them.
- 8.5 It was opined by DG that some soul searching was required on part of BIS as the image branding was not coming up and we need to restore the confidence BIS Standard Mark aspired in olden days. She further emphasized that we must take responsibility that belong to us and change our work environment as per needs of time and identify the resources that are required for the same.
- **8.6** Video-conferencingfacility to be made operative in all Branch Offices by December end as next meeting in January 2018 would be done through video conferencing and DDGRs of all regions to take the responsibility of their Branches and also ensure integrity and timely information of MCR.
- **8.7** With regard to Man-Power utilization, lot of time was wasted in lot inspection, however, views were expressed by some of the officers that it should not be outsourced. DG expressed that we have to find some solution for more effective utilization of manpower.
- **8.8** DG stated that most of the Laboratories are under-utilized as they are receiving 35% less samples and are also not well-equipped. She informed that she will have comprehensive review of laboratories very shortly.
- 8.9 DG informed that some of the junior officers have raised the TA/DA issue. It was decided that DDG (PP&C) to nominate a three members committee.
- **8.10** It was decided that **DPR to identify organizations / NGOs** that would help BIS in organizing consumer awareness programmes and other activities.
- **8.11 ITSD to discuss with NIC** and assess the situation with regard to slow speed of internet.
- **8.12** During the elaborate interactive session on presentation with respect to Conformity Assessment Regulations, no firm opinion emerged regarding

inclusion of STI or ITP for operation of licences under product certification scheme.

- 8.13 The proposal for **Desktop scrutiny by licensees to be reviewed and pilot** project to be taken up at WRO region, Pune
- **8.14** Training programme to be organized for **QC Officers of licensees by NITS** at different regions.
- 8.15 Product Manual to be prepared by officers in various ROs and BOsfrom January 2018 onwards. The same would be reviewed in the next ROs/BOs meeting.
- **8.16** DG further expressed that BIS should have**knowledge sharingmechanism**with technical experts wherein questions can be posted on the portal based on which FAQs may be prepared.
- **8.17** Lectures on technical subjects may be organized in various regions also inviting experts.

#### 9. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

At the end of the meeting a token gift was presented by DG to the two BIS officers superannuating in December 2017.
