SPECIFICATION FOR BEATEN RICE

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and test for beaten rice.

FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 31 January 1981, after the draft finalized by the Food grains and Foodgrain Industries Sectional Committee had been approved by the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

0.2 Beaten rice, also known as *CHEWDA*, is commonly consumed as a snack food after frying and adding salt and spices for taste. It is also consumed with milk and sugar.

0.3 Beaten rice is produced from paddy by a process of soaking in hot water drying hand-roasting and then flaking followed by sieving and dehusking. There is an increasing demand for beaten rice in India particularly in eastern region. It is expected that the formulation of the standard on this product would facilitate the availability of beaten rice of known quality.

0.4 In preparation of this standard considerable assistance has been derived from ASC Specification.
