**SPECIFICATION FOR
MEAT EXTRACT (BEEF), FOOD GRADE**

0. FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on, 16 July 1986, after the draft finalized by the Meat Industry Sectional Committee had been approved by the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

0.2 Meat extract is a by-product and is widely used as a food item. It is usually prepared as a concentrated product by the evaporation, under vacuum, of aqueous extract, produced by cooking cattle meat including buffaloes in water.

0.3 In the preparation of this standard, due consideration has been given to the provisions of the *Prevention of Food Adulteration Act*, 1954, and the Rules framed thereunder. However, this standard is subject to the restrictions imposed under these, wherever applicable.

0.4 This edition 1.1 incorporates Amendment No. 1 (March 2004). Side bar indicates modification of the text as the result of incorporation of the amendment.

0.5 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS : 2-1960*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes methods of sampling and test for meat extract (beef), food grade.
