Indian Standard SPECIFICATION FOR INLAND PACKAGING OF COTTON CLOTH AND YARN

0. FOREWORD

- **0.1** This Indian Standard (First Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 18 August 1972, after the draft finalized by the Cotton and Cotton Products Sectional Committee had been approved by the Textile Division Council.
- **0.2** This standard was first published in 1959. The present revision has been undertaken to effect certain modifications in the procedures prescribed For packaging grey and processed cloth in hales and cases. Provision for bag packaging of yam has also been included.

1. SCOPE

- 1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements of packaging of cotton cloth and yarn intended for overland transport.
- 1.2 If goods are to be transported long distances over internal waterways or to be transported overland where distance is great, time taken in transit is considerable and climatic conditions are variable; or where the goods are to be frequently unloaded and reloaded in transit, the method of packaging as prescribed in IS: 293-1967* may be followed.
