# **FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRODUCTS — DETERMINATION OF WATER-INSOLUBLE SOLIDS**

**( *First Revision* )**

### **1 Scope**

This International Standard specifies a method for the determination of the content of water-insoluble solids in the edible parts of fruit and vegetable products.

### **NATIONAL FOREWORD**

This Indian Standard ( First Revision ) which is identical with ISO 751 : 1998 'Fruit and vegetable products — Determination of water-insoluble solids' issued by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO ) was adopted by the Bureau of Indian Standards on the recommendations of the Processed Fruit and Vegetable Products Sectional Committee and approval of the Food and Agriculture Division Council.

This standard was originally published in 1993 based on the earlier version of the International Standard, namely, ISO 751 :1981 under dual numbering. This is being revised to align with the revised version, namely, ISO 751 :1998.

In the adopted standard, certain terminology and conventions are not identical to those used in the Indian Standards. Attention is particularly drawn to the following:

- a) Wherever the words 'International Standard' appear referring to this standard, they should be read as 'Indian Standard'; and
- b) Comma ( , ) has been used as a decimal marker while in Indian Standards, the current practice is to use a point ( . ) as the decimal marker.

In reporting the results of a test or analysis made in accordance with this standard, if the final value, observed or calculated, is to be rounded off, it shall be done in accordance with IS 2:1960 'Rules for rounding off numerical values ( *revised* )'.
