Indian Standard SPECIFICATION FOR COTTON NEWAR

$\mathbf{0.} \quad \mathbf{FOREWORD}$

0.1 This Indian Standard (Second Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 11 January 1982, after the draft finalized by the Narrow Fabrics, Webbings and Braids Sectional Committee had been approved by the Textile Division Council.

0.2 This standard was first publised in 1970 and was based on IND/ TC/0311 Tape Newar (Ministry of Defence). The present revision has been taken up for making it up to date in the light of the experience already gained.

0.3 The Standards of Weights and Measures Act, 1976 stipulates use of the International System of Units in the country; in order to familiarize the industry with this system, the recommended SI units for use in the textile industry are given in Appendix A.

0.4 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS : 2-1960*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard covers grey, scoured, bleached or dyed cotton *NEWAR* of width 13, 25, 40, 50, 65, 75, 90 and 100 mm.
