SPECIFICATION FOR
MULTI-TRIP GLASS BEER BOTTLES

0. FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard *Second Revision* was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 30 March 1983, after the draft finalized by the Glass Containers Sectional Committee had been approved by the Marine, Cargo Movement and Packaging Division Council.

0.2 This standard was first published in 1962 and subsequently revised in 1973. In the present revision the requirements of overall height and diameter, and their tolerances have been specified to reduce the variety in size of bottles used by different distillers in the country. The details of neck finish have been referred to in IS : 7511-1973*. Fire finishing requirement for sealing surface has been substituted by closure integrity along with other modification in the standard.

0.3 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS : 2-1969†. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and tests for multi-trip glass beer bottles.
