SPECIFICATION FOR POMFRET CANNED IN OIL

(First Revision)

1 SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and test for white (*Stromateus cinerus*), silver (*Pampus argenteus*) and brown (*Parastromateus niger*) pomfrets canned in oil.

FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard (First Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 11 November 1971, after the draft finalized by the Fish and Fisheries Products Sectional Committee had been approved by the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

0.2 Pomfret is usually canned in oil. In order to ensure the quality and wholesomeness of the finished product, various physical, chemical, microbiological and hygienic requirements have been prescribed in this standard. The formulation of this standard was undertaken at the instance of the Development Council for Food Processing Industries.

0.3 This standard was first published in 1962. The various provisions of that standard have been under the review of the Sectional Committee from time to time and the present revision was taken up with a view to modifying the earlier requirements in the light of experience gained both by processors and users.
