## (PREVIEW) Indian Standard SPECIFICATION FOR BRUSH, COMMODE CHUTES

## $\mathbf{0.} \quad \mathbf{FOREWORD}$

**0.1** This Indian Standard (First Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 12 November 1976, after the draft finalized by the Brushware Sectional Committee had been approved by the Chemical Division Council.

**0.2** This standard was published in 1964. In this revision besides incorporating Amendment No. 1, non-metric units have been deleted and moisture content limit raised from 12 to 15 percent.

**0.3** Brushes with palmyra fibre are used by the Indian Railways and other organizations for cleaning of commodes and squatting pans, having either short or long chutes.

**0.4** This specification, covering the requirements of brush for commode chutes, is essentially based on the type of brush covered by IND/GS Specification 473-A Brushes, W.C., G.S., Ministry of Defence (CGDP).

**0.5** For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS :  $2-1960^*$ . The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

## 1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and test for brush, commode chutes.
