**FOREWORD**

**0.1** This Indian Standard was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 3 April 1966, after the draft finalized by the Fruits and Vegetables Sectional Committee had been approved by the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

**0.2** Pickles occupy an important place among the traditional foods processed in India, and there is good scope for the development of their external as well as internal trade. It is, however, necessary to ensure their quality by exercising strict quality control which may be done on the basis of this Indian Standard.

**0.3** This standard is one of a series of Indian Standards on processed fruits and vegetables.

**0.4** In the preparation of this standard, due consideration has been given to the provisions of the *Prevention of Food Adulteration Act*, 1954 and the Rules framed thereunder and the Fruit Products Order, 1955. This standard is subject to the restrictions imposed under these, wherever applicable.

**0.5** For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS: 2-1960\*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.
