SPECIFICATION FOR MUSTARD OIL

FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard (Second Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 25 September 1975, after the draft finalized by the Oils and Oilseeds Sectional Committee had been approved by the Chemical Division Council and the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

0.2 This standard was first published in 1954 and subsequently revised in 1963. India is one of the largest producers of mustard and rape seeds in the world. The chief producing areas in the country of mustard and rape seeds are Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. The vegetable oil derived from the seeds of rape and mustard is popularly known as *SARSON-KA-TEL* (सरसो का तेल).

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes requirements and methods of sampling and test for mustard oil used for edible and industrial purposes.
