SPECIFICATION FOR PROTECTIVE LEATHER CLOTHING

0. FOREWORD

- **0.1** This Indian Standard was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 29 May 1971, after the draft finalized by the Leather Sectional Committee had been approved by the Chemical Division Council.
- **0.2** This Indian Standard prescribes the general requirements for protective clothings other than gloves and safety footwear. Requirements for gloves and footwear are covered in IS: 2573-1963*, IS: 2574-1963†, IS: 2575-1963‡ and IS: 3737-1967§. The specification does not deal with any particular design, but deals with essential aspects of design and construction from the users point of view.
- **0.3** This standard contains clauses **5.2** and **6.1** which call for agreement between the purchaser and the supplier.
- **0.4** This edition 1.1 incorporates Amendment No. 1 (May 1998). Side bar indicates modification of the text as the result of incorporation of the amendment.
- **0.5** For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS: 2-1960 \parallel . The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and tests for protective clothings made from leather. It applies to jackets, capes, sleeves, aprons, spats and leggings.
