SPECIFICATION FOR EDIBLE SPRAY DRIED POTATO FLOUR

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and test for edible spray dried potato flour.

FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 27 April 1979 after the draft finalized by the Edible Starches and Starch Products Sectional Committee had been approved by the Agricultural and Food Products Division Council.

0.2 Potato flour is used by bakery industry in the production of bread, *ROTI*, etc. The flour is now commercially produced in the country. It is felt that an Indian Standard for this product would help in production of spray dried potato flour of proper quality suitable for human consumption and also facilitate the consumer in getting right quality product. An outline of the method for the production of edible spray dried potato flour is given in Appendix A for guidance only.

0.3 In the preparation of this standard, due consideration has been given to the provision of the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954 and the Rules framed thereunder. However, this standard is subject to restrictions imposed under the Act, wherever applicable.

0.4 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS : 2-1960*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.
