

## Rules & Regulations

**1. (a) Structure of Grading of Academic Performance**

S.N.	Academic Performance	Grades	Grades points
1	Outstanding	A+	10
2	Excellent	A	9
3	Very good	B+	8
4	Good	B	7
5	Average - satisfactory	C+	6
6	Below average	C	5
7	Marginal	D	4
8	Poor	E, E1 & E2	0
9	Very Poor	F	0

**(b) Calculation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)**

The result of each student for each semester shall be worked out and provided in terms of Grades for each course, the semester grade point average of a student shall be calculated on the basis of the number of credits (Ci) assigned to any course (i) of that semester and grade points (Pi) earned in that course (based on overall grade obtained) by the formula at the RHS.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n Ci \cdot Pi}{\sum_{i=1}^n Ci}$$

**(c) Calculation of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)**

Cumulative grade point average of a student for any number of semesters shall be obtained by the formula at RHS, where Ci is the total no. of credits assigned to any semester (ith) and Si is the SGPA obtained in that semester (ith).

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n Ci \cdot Si}{\sum_{i=1}^n Ci}$$

**2. Minimum passing marks/grades in individual component/overall in each course shall be as follows:**

- (a) For all UG (except Pharmacy) Course/Paper Individual - Component - 30% Overall Grade D
- (d) For any UG Pharmacy and every PG course/Paper Individual - Component - 40% Overall Grade C

Note : I Symbol # against a Grade indicates grade changed in scrutiny  
II Symbol < against a Grade indicate grade changed after reappear

**3. A student failing in a course will be awarded any of the following four grades depending on his/her performance:**

- (a) Grade E1, if a student is failing only in Continuous Evaluation
- (b) Grade E2, if a student is failing only in End Semester Examination
- (C) Grade E, if a student fails to secure overall minimum passing marks but has secured minimum passing marks in both the individual components
- (d) Grade F, if a student is failing in both the components.

**4. Promotion to next higher class:**

- (a) Promotion shall be made on annual basis i.e. on the basis of performance at both the semesters of an academic year if he/she clears fifty Percent of course/papers (separately in theory and practicals).
- (b) Special Back Papers Examinations shall be held immediately after the declaration of result of even semester, to clear the uncleared end semester examinations of theory courses of both semesters held in a year.
- (c) A student who wants to clear/improve his result of both the components (continuous evaluation and end semester evaluation) of theory as well as practicals shall be required to apply within 10 days of the declaration of the result to appear with the next batch of the semester concerned, e.g. a third semester student who wants to improve his first semester continuous evaluation or Practical result shall be required to appear for the same with the first semester batch the following year, a fourth semester student with the second semester batch and so on.
- (d) A student, who has been promoted to the next higher class but has not cleared all the courses of that class shall be required to clear such back papers at the next earliest opportunity.

**5. In case any mistake is detected during the preparation of the mark sheet or brought to notice afterwards, the University will be fully empowered to correct the same.**

**6. (a) Award of Degree:**

A student shall be eligible for the award of a degree if he successfully completes all the course (s) leading to that degree within the prescribed maximum duration and secures a minimum CGPA of 5.0 in all UG programmes excluding Pharmacy and CGPA of 5.5 in UG Pharmacy and any PG programme.

(b) Equivalent percentage (if required) may be calculated by the approximate formula: Equivalent Percentage = CGPA X 9.3.

**7. Minimum duration of courses: In years under semester scheme: M.Tech., M.Pharma., MBA(Regular), MBA (IT & Comm.), MBA (IB), PGDBM, M.Sc., Biosciences is 2 yrs. B.Sc. (Biotech), BCA, BBA, MCA is 3 yrs. B.Pharma., B.Tech, BHMCT is 4 yrs. Dual Degree (BBA + MBA) is 4.5 yrs. & Dual Degree (B.Tech + M.Tech) is 5 yrs.**

**8. Candidates desiring scrutiny of their results should apply on the prescribed form downloaded from University website so as to reach the Controller of Examinations within twenty one days from the date of declaration of th result. Applications received after the due date will NOT BE ENTERTAINED in any case. Scrutiny is not permitted for those candidates who have appeared in the back paper(s) examinations.**
