IS 1932: 1986

The Indian Standard, IS 1932: 1986 titled 'Mustard and rape seed oilcake as Livestock Feed Ingredient', was adopted on January 31, 1986, serves as a guideline for its use as livestock feed and prescribes the requirements & methods of sampling and test for the product. This second revision updates requirements and testing methods, building on the original 1961 publication and the 1972 revision. The standard categorizes oilcake into two types: 'Hydraulic or expeller or Rotary pressed' [further subdivided High Fat (HF) and Low Fat (LF) grades] and 'Ghani or Kolhu pressed',

Key requirements mandate that the oilcake be free from harmful constituents, rancidity, adulterants, and extraneous matter. It must comply with specified limits (depending upon the Type or Grade) for moisture (max 10-12%), crude protein (33-37%), crude fat (min 8-12%), crude fibre (7-9%), Total ash (8-9%) and Acid-insoluble ash (1.5-2.5%). The method of tests is specified in IS 7874(Part-1).

Packaging guidelines require the use of clean & sound Jute or HDPE bags, or as agreed between the purchaser & vendor. Each bag is required to be marked with clear labelling that includes the name, type, grade, manufacturer's name, batch number, net mass, and packing date. Sampling and testing should follow established methods to ensure compliance and quality control. Sampling and conformity criteria shall be as prescribed in Appendix C of IS 2052.
